The sociology major requires **34** credit hours, the second major requires **28** hours, and the minor requires **21** hours.

Grade Point Average: A cumulative GPA of 2.0 (C) is required for admission to and graduation from the sociology major. Courses taken as CR/NC do not count toward the major, second major, or minor.

Prerequisites: Core (bolded) courses must be taken in the order listed. Generally, students should follow core courses in sequence, beginning with 1000- level requirements, proceeding to 2000-level requirements, and so on. Some upper-division electives require other courses as prerequisites.

Concentrations: Students *may* select from a list designated courses that provide a concentration in Pre-Law or Human Services and Social Policy. Requirements are listed on page 3 of this document. *Concentrations are possible for Majors and Second Majors.*
