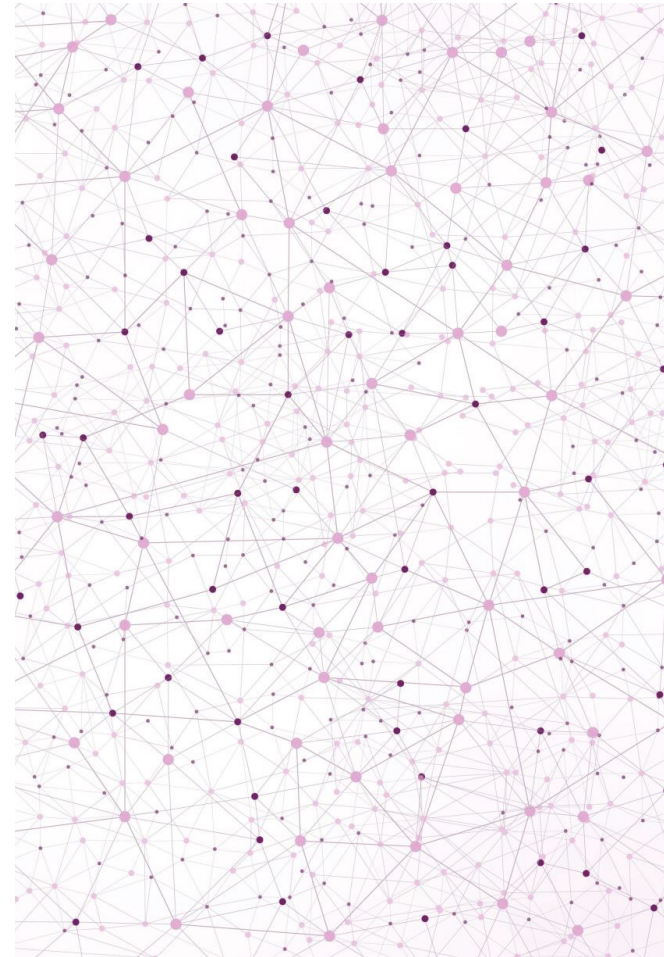


SOCIOLOGY 488: SOCIOLOGY AND CRIMINOLOGY INTERNSHIP

DETAILS

- Students pick their organization to work with, this can be a place they are working at already, or a new organization that they want to gain experience in;
- In the past students have worked across the criminal legal system from the federal to local level, at research institutes at the University and privately operated, in social service agencies, and in for-profit companies.
- Students are expected to work in their organization around 10 hours per week for the 3 credits and 20 hours per week for 6 credits;
- There is a one-hour seminar on Mondays from 12 to 12:50 on campus but can be attended remotely through Zoom. In that class students discuss organizational ethnography techniques through their reading of articles or chapters that employ ethnographic methods where students learn to study, among other things, power dynamics and interactions in the workplace;
- Students do a short writing exercise each week related to the articles they read to prepare for the Monday discussions;
- Students, finally, write a short "ethnography" of their organization as a final project.
